



Customs Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (CTPAT) Statement of Support

Implemented in 2001, CTPAT is a voluntary program, designed to build cooperative relationships and provide cargo security through Importers, Carriers, Licensed Brokers, and Manufacturers. US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) requests that businesses ensure the integrity of their security practices and communicate their security guidelines to their business partners within the supply chain.

StandardAero is a proud member of the CTPAT program, dedicated to promoting a culture of security, and to ensure laws and regulations are followed through organizational commitment for the security of our Supply Chain. An organized committee has been developed to confirm compliance is being followed and executed.

As an importer, StandardAero, to include its executives, management, and other policy-makers, commits to participate in the CTPAT program. StandardAero recognizes the importance of this program, and it is policy of StandardAero to:

- Ensure the secure import of goods by implementing, following, and maintaining multi-layered security procedures and practices that are consistent with the CTPAT Importer Security Criteria.
- Cooperate with CBP and other law enforcement agencies in their efforts to ensure the security of the supply chain.
- Provide security guidelines and training for StandardAero employees, contractors, service providers, and others associated with the company.
- Provide a safe and secure environment for our employees, customers, vendors, other visitors and goods.
- Investigate any situation or significant event which may be related to a breach in cargo security or any CTPAT criteria and notify the proper authorities.
- Review, revise, and update security policies and procedures on a regular basis, or as needed.

StandardAero believes security is everyone's responsibility. As a member of the CTPAT program all StandardAero U.S. sites are expected to comply with the CTPAT Importer Security Criteria as well as all security policies, procedures and instruction set out by the CTPAT Committee.
